

## **Ghana August 2010 Financial Report**

### **Trip Costs**

50 Water Filters: \$2,271.50

Foreign currency fees: \$22.86

Shipping/Cargo: \$69

Transportation: \$138

Hygiene Class Supplies: \$55

Food: \$66

Water Filter Containers: \$120

Lodging: \$400

Jewelry from Cooperative: \$1416.94

### **Trip Outcomes**

- Water filters provide clean water for 454 individuals, 2 medical clinics, an orphanage and a primary school with approximately 400 students –average home size was 12 individuals and average household monthly income was \$86 US
- Short hygiene courses taught in conjunction with filter courses to approximately 100 adults and 50 children
- Provided hygiene supplies for 42 families
- Started the formation of 2 youth development soccer teams
- Created 1 full-time position for monitoring of water filters.
- Established a jewelry cooperative for women in Veve that will later expand to be a microcredit loan group as well
- Currently working to provide a surgery in Accra, Ghana to a child with an external bladder birth defect.
- Currently working to better equip Korle-Bu Teaching Hospital in Accra, Ghana through hospital partnerships in the US

### **Real Life Fellowship Partner:**

- Drilled a borehole for the medical clinic
- Provided medical and dental aid and medicine to the community free of charge
- Conducted repairs for Mama Laadi's orphanage
- Provided the funding for the water filters
- Provided needed care and attention for hundreds of children
